<b>Notes to Degree Plan</b>	
<b>(1) BIBLE CREDIT:</b> Traditional students must complete BI 1073, 1083, 1093, and one of BI 3213, 3433 or 4213. Students should take the courses in consecutive order unless they are registered for an approved non-Bible course that meets the Bible requirement. A student who is enrolled in an approved non-Bible course will defer the required BI course sequence until the following semester.	
<b>(2) BIOLOGICAL SCIENCE:</b> Choose one from BY 1003, EV 1013, or SCI 1003.	
<b>(3) PHYSICAL SCIENCE:</b> Choose one from CM 1013, PH 1003, PH 1013, SU 2013, SCI 1013.	
<b>(4) MATH OR SCIENCE:</b> Students must complete 15 semester hours of a math and/or science. Courses may be chosen from the following areas: Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science, Information Technology, Mathematics, Physics, and Engineering.	
<b>(5) THEORY PLACEMENT EXAM:</b> Given prior to enrollment in MU 1133.	
<b>(6) PIANO PROFICIENCY REQUIRED:</b> Students must attempt MU 4020 by end of sophomore year. It is strongly recommended that students enroll in MU 1652 at the beginning of the freshman year and continue to study until the proficiency is passed. If the proficiency is not passed by the end of the sophomore year, students must enroll in piano until the barrier is passed.	
<b>(7) AUDITION TO ENTER DEPT:</b> Students must audition on major performance medium no later than end of first semester of study.	
<b>(8) ENSEMBLES:</b> Instrumental majors must enroll in MU 1051 or MU 1091.	
<b>(9) ENSEMBLE CREDIT:</b> Upon the advice of the student's advisor, some ensembles may be taken for no credit.	
<b>(10) ELECTIVES:</b> Enrollment in MU 1652, MU 1611 and ensembles may serve as electives.	

**Failure to do the following may result in a delay of graduation.**

1. Plan schedules carefully, so as to fulfill all pre-requisites for the next semester's courses.  
Waivers for pre-requisite courses will be granted only under extreme circumstances.
2. Check with your academic advisor before changing the sequence of courses since some are not offered every semester.
3. Check your account early to allow time to eliminate any hold that might prevent pre-registration.
4. Pre-register early to secure classes needed for graduation requirements.
